HOUSE FIRE - 233 COTTONWOOD

In last month's News & Views, we indicated that we were still awaiting the official cause of the house fire at 233 Cottonwood and would notify our residents once we received final notification. While we would have preferred to provide you with an exact cause, the HCFD has now officially declared the cause of the fire as Undetermined. They indicated that the fire, which started in the attic area, was so severe that no determination could be made as to the exact cause.

As a reminder, the HCFD is available to assist you in ensuring your smoke detectors are working properly. They will be happy to come to your home, check and change batteries and confirm your detectors are operating correctly. LAKE MAINTENANCE & PRESERVATION STUDY COMMITTEE

Since last July, a group of dedicated residents have met to discuss the condition and future maintenance of our storm water management facilities, otherwise known as retention ponds, water pumps, diffusers, water transmission pipes, drainage pipes, swales, storm water outfall drains and lake bank retaining walls. The Board was recently provided with a comprehensive report of their research and recommendations and we'd like to thank each and every one of those members who gave of their time and said yes to serving on this committee. The committee was chaired by Dave Atkins and included Jon Bourne, Ellen Elliott, Renzo Falcinelli, Les Gerhart, Pat Hosford, Leo Reger and Mike Reynolds.

Because of the time and effort of those members, the Board now has the information available to us so that we can review it and consider the recommendations submitted. We will then decide on how to best proceed to ensure the preservation of our storm water management facilities.

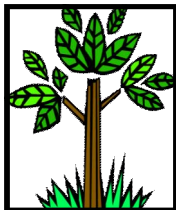

PROPERTY COMMITTEE

Well, we had another successful pool opening on May 1st. Hopefully Mother Nature will cooperate soon with some nice sunny, warm weather. Please take the opportunity to get up to the pool and enjoy it.

This year we had forty-nine requests for sod replacement submitted. Al Hardee, one of his co-workers and myself visited each property where a request was made. A note detailing what will be done was placed in the newspaper box. Al will create a list of instructions that will insure that the new sod and seed will germinate and grow to maturity in no time. Proper care is essential to success.

In response to residents concerns about the safety of exiting from Loblolly and Candlewood onto Myrtle Trace Drive due to the speed of traffic in that area, the Property Committee contacted the County to see what could be done to reduce speed and improve safety. The County was very cooperative and responsive to the HOA concerns and felt that the best solution at this time would be to install curve signs in both directions of the approaches to the curve. This work has been completed. Later this year, the County also plans on re-paving and repainting the lines in that area, thus increasing visibility. We'll be watching.
