## BOARD BRIEFS

### THANK YOU, KAREN

Karen Bevan, our Accounts Receivable Contractor, has submitted her resignation to be effective October 1, 2016. We'd like to thank Karen for her many years of dedication to our community and wish her the very best.

The search for her replacement has commenced and any Myrtle Trace residents who might be interested are encouraged to submit an application. A summary of relevant experience as well as personal references should be included in the application. A familiarity with Quick Books would be beneficial. A full description of position responsibilities is published in the inner section of the News & Views. The job description along with instructions for applying has also been posted on our web site and on the Clubhouse Bulletin Board. Applications should be submitted to Dave Smyth, 180 Myrtle Trace Drive, no later than Friday, September 2, 2016.

### POSITION AVAILABLE

The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association will receive the applications of interested persons to provide, as a private contractor, twice weekly, scheduled cleaning services within the Clubhouse building and Cabana restrooms. The cleaning contractor retained shall receive, for his or her services, compensation at a rate of \$350.00 per completed month of cleaning the Clubhouse and \$45.00 per completed month of cleaning the Cabana restrooms for the months that the pool is in use. The cleaning contractor, at his or her expense, shall supply all cleaning equipment necessary to fulfill scheduled cleaning services and maintain necessary insurance coverage, providing the Association with a Certificate of Insurance prior to undertaking contracted services.

To receive a copy of the cleaning schedule to be followed, interested persons may contact Nancy Southard, Director at Large.

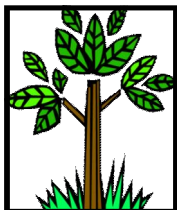

## PROPERTY COMMITTEE

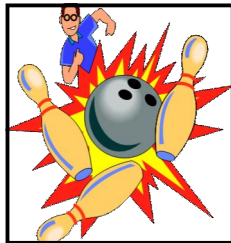
Our lakes are looking pretty nice for this time of year. Mother Nature has been kind with all the rain she has given us. But, as you have seen in prior years, this could change in a heartbeat. If the rain amount drops, and temperatures stay warm, the lakes will start to evaporate and the familiar scum will return to the surface. Although the scum does nothing for the aesthetics, it is not a health hazard.

Algae may also start to appear. This is caused primarily by the phosphates contained in fertilizers. The manufactures are cutting back on the amount they use, but they still are present. Of the three numbers on a fertilizer bag, the middle number is Phosphate. When purchasing fertilizer please buy one with the lowest number you can find. In the spring, our lakes management company can control the algae by spraying the lakes with algaecide but, as the waters warm and temperatures rise, this could cause fish kill, so they have to cut back on its use.

So lets hope that this weather pattern continues to keep the lakes looking nice for the rest of the summer.

One last comment. When riding bikes in the community please ride WITH traffic, not against. This is for your own safety and makes it easier for traffic to navigate around you. Thank you, enjoy the rest of the summer.

## MYRTLE TRACE COMMUNITY CHORUS - New Season

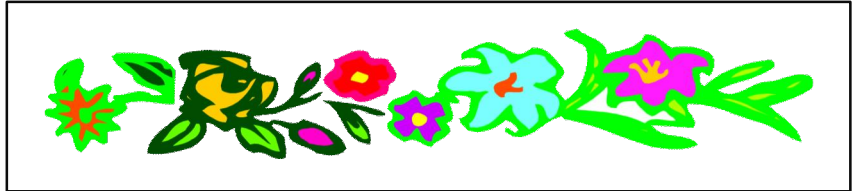

## POSITION AVAILABLE

The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association will receive the applications of interested persons to provide, as a private contractor, Accounts Receivable services. The Accounts Receivable Contractor retained shall receive, for his or her services, compensation of \$3,300.00 per year. Said amount shall be paid in equal monthly installments of \$275.00 on the first day of the month.

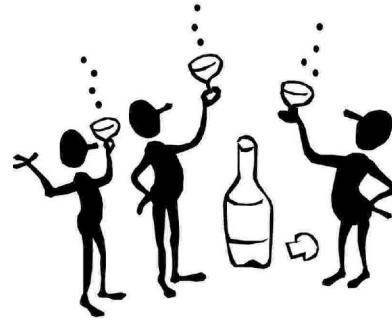
Duties of the Accounts Receivable Contractor include, but are not limited to the following:

- a. Check the Association mailbox (101 Myrtle Trace Drive) and drop box at the Association Clubhouse daily for incoming correspondence. Also collect and deposit money from the use of the copy machine.
- b. Distribute all mail and information received daily to the appropriate addressee or to persons designated by the Board of Directors.
- c. Post all checks and monies received in a receivables ledger. Deposit all monies received in the designated bank account.
- d. Contact Association members regarding non-payment or over-payment of monthly maintenance fees. Apply, record and collect penalty fees where applicable. Notify Board of Directors when a member is delinquent over ninety (90) days.
- e. Furnish closing attorneys with information regarding the status of a home seller's account and amounts due from the purchaser.
- f. Accept payments from residents for mail boxes, posts and nameplates and notify the Maintenance Contractor when and where to install such items.
- g. Notify the Board of Directors, the Administrative Consultant and the Communications Committee of house closings as they occur. Notify Communications Committee of changes in mailing addresses of non-resident members as they occur.
- h. All records are to be computerized. Copies of real estate correspondence, HUD-1 real estate settlement documents and general correspondence should be maintained as hard copies and filed in the Clubhouse after one year.
- i. Provide Administrative Consultant with monthly reports.
- j. Accounts Receivable will provide orientation, training and updating relating to the responsibilities under this contract to an individual(s) designated by the Board of Directors.
- k. Any other reasonable duties to be agreed upon by the Board of Directors for the Association and Accounts Receivable.

The Accounts Receivable Contractor is required to represent and acknowledge that he/she is an independent contractor and not an employee of the Association.

The Accounts Receivable Contractor shall provide, at their own expense and on their own premises, the necessary equipment, software and supplies for the performance of the agreed services.

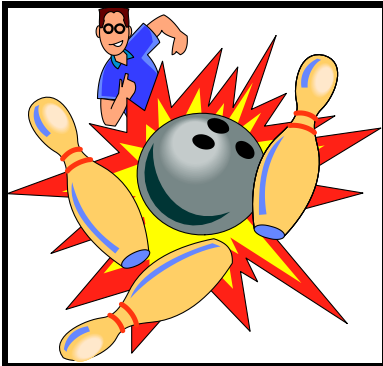

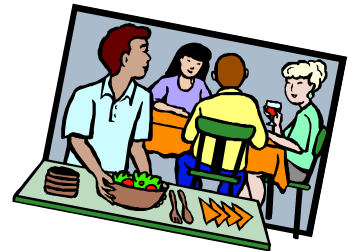
