## BOARD BRIEFS

### SCAMS

The scams keep coming! During the past few weeks, at least three different types of scams have been seen in our neighborhood. Two of them originate on the Internet.

E-mails are being received supposedly from Horry Telephone Cooperative advising the recipient that their e-mail account will be shut down unless they contact the sender to correct the problem. HTC will never send an e-mail regarding a problem – they will contact you in person. The purpose of this scam is to gain access to your e-mail account so they can flood it with spam.

Another Internet scam is a pop-up on your computer telling you that you have viruses which will destroy your hard drive or make your computer crash. You are told to follow instructions which include providing a credit card number so that the “problem” can be fixed. Of course there never was a problem but the money is gone! If you wish to have your computer checked, contact one of the computer technicians listed on the Myrtle Trace website or another bonafide repair service.

The third scam is the emergency call from a “grandson” or “granddaughter” asking for money to help with a problem. The best defense in this situation is to ask the “grandchild” questions that only the “real” grandchild could answer.

### TRUCKS

It has come to our attention that trucks are being left out in driveways for indefinite periods of time and are not being properly garaged as per our Covenants.

Please be reminded that other than when in temporary use – loading, unloading, trucks are to be garaged at all times, including of course during the overnight hours.

We expect and appreciate your compliance.

## PROPERTY COMMITTEE

September is the month that all residents may apply to the Board of Directors for a Myrtle Trace Home Owners Maintenance Agreement. What this agreement does is transfer the responsibility of maintaining the Common Area adjacent to homeowners' property from the HOA to the homeowner. The Maintenance Agreement application can be obtained from your Phase Representative. The Reps' names and phone numbers are listed on the back of the Myrtle Trace phone directory. The Phase Rep will review the application with you and answer any questions you may have regarding the agreement. Once you have signed the agreement, place it in the Homeowners slot at the Clubhouse near the front door. The agreement will be reviewed by the Board and you will receive a written notice sometime in October. You may also elect to discontinue your Maintenance Agreement at this time. Until you receive your final notification Hardee Maintenance will continue to maintain your Common Ground. The last day the Board will accept applications is Friday September 30, 2016. There will be no exceptions.

You may or may not have noticed that we have new address plaques on the Clubhouse, Pool Cabana and the Maintenance Building. To make a long story short, Pear Tree Circle was never listed in the 911 Data Base. To correct this situation, the Zoning Board has assigned new numbers to each building. In case of a possible emergency, the new addresses are the Clubhouse - 110 Pear Tree Circle, Pool - 120 Pear Tree Circle and the Maintenance Building - 125 Pear Tree Circle. The phone company has assured us that whenever we call 911 from any of these numbers the addresses will be identifiable in their system. Note: Our mailing address will continue to be 101 Myrtle Trace Dr. Conway S.C. 29526

The last thing I would like to address is the disposal of yard waste (grass clippings etc.) in the Common Property wooded areas. There is a large accumulation of waste along Burning Ridge Road near the pump house. This can become a fire hazard and a haven for unwanted pests. I am sure there other areas were this has been a practice. Please STOP. We do not have the resources or the manpower to clean these areas up. Also, please inform your lawn care contractors to refrain as well. Thank you.

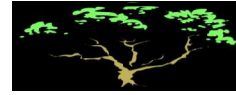

## OUR “LAKES” - A VITAL PART OF OUR INFRASTRUCTURE

The fifteen retention ponds (lakes) in Myrtle Trace, besides being at times, esthetically pleasing, play a very important role in our community. The two primary purposes of these ponds are to: (1) serve as a catch basin for storm water run-off and (2) to reduce water pollution by allowing time for the sediment and other pollutants to settle before the water reaches the county ditch.

The retention ponds require maintenance. The Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association has, for many years, undertaken several actions in an effort to prolong the life of our ponds. These actions include: stocking the ponds with sterile carp; employing the services of Estate Management to defoliate unwanted algae; installing diffusers; and installing retaining walls to stabilize the pond banks. However, pollutants, yard debris and run-off from roadways continue to enter the ponds and the sediment continues to build up on the bottom of the ponds. As the sediment layers continue to build, the capacity of the pond is diminished and has an adverse effect on functionality. The Code of Ordinances of Horry County requires storm water systems (our ponds) to be maintained by the owners; in our case the Myrtle Trace Homeowners Association. Furthermore, the State recommends when the capacity of a retention pond is at 50%, the pond should be dredged. It is inevitable, the Myrtle Trace Homeowners will, at some point have to dredge a portion or portions of our ponds. One has to remember, the retention ponds in Myrtle Trace were dug by the developer as each phase was developed; this means that some of these ponds are over thirty (30) years old.

The Myrtle Trace Board of Directors, in 2015, established an ad hoc committee whose charge was to identify actions, develop a plan and make recommendations for a maintenance program which would further prolong the life of the ponds and hopefully delay the ultimate action, dredging. This ad hoc committee known as the Lake Maintenance and Preservation Committee held numerous meetings over a course of nine months. The meetings involved overview of our retention ponds and what we have been doing to maintain them; members examining the outflows and swales; and gaining information from guest speakers in the fields of storm water drainage and lake management. In April 2016, the Committee submitted to the Board of Directors a report outlining the findings of the Committee and the report included a number of recommendations which were prioritized by tiers.

The Board of Directors reviewed the report and concurred with Committee’s recommendation to determine the depth of some of our ponds. The Board contracted with Estate Management to conduct Bathymetry surveys of eleven (11) of our retention ponds. The technology will determine the thickness of the sediment and the actual original hard pack depth of each of these ponds. This information, in addition to providing baseline data on pond depths, will help determine what pond(s) or portion of them may require dredging. The Bathymetry survey was done using a small radio controlled boat which had a camera and sonar on board. The controller standing on land could see on his tablet screen what the equipment on board was recording. Once the survey of the ponds is completed Estate Management will submit a written report. The Board of Directors will use the results and the recommendations of the Lake Maintenance and Preservation Committee to begin development of a long range plan for our “lakes”.

Our total income for that time period is right on track at 59%. Our expenses of \$225,090 as of July 31st, were under the projected budget of \$238,847. As previously noted, we are experiencing unanticipated expenses due to the breakdown of some of our aging infrastructure, such as the pool pump and motor, drain lines, etc. and are facing the likelihood of future expenses regarding dredging of some lakes. Next month look for a brief note concerning our two designated funds.

## BOARD BRIEFS (CONT'D.)

### CATS

It has come to our attention that pet droppings, along with cat litter are being improperly disposed of, in particular in the area of Myrtle Trace Drive and Timberline. We've also been made aware of homeowners allowing their cats to roam freely, causing a nuisance and disturbance to fellow residents. We realize that the majority of homeowners abide by the Policy on Pets and Feeding and/or Sheltering Stray/Feral Cats (listed below) and we thank them, but for those who don't, it shows a lack of respect and consideration for your community and fellow neighbors.

Our policy is as follows. Please note that individuals are subject to monetary fines for violating this policy.

#### **Policy On Pets and Feeding and/or Sheltering of Stray/Feral Cats**

**When off the owner's property, all pets including cats must be leashed.**

**Renters, and/or guests, who have pets, must abide by these guidelines.**

**When walking pets in any common or deeded area in Myrtle Trace, it is the walker's responsibility for picking up the pet's droppings.**

**If an unleashed dog or cat whose ownership is known is observed on common areas or on private property other than that of the pet's owner, or there is evidence of a resident feeding and/or sheltering stray/feral cats, the complaining resident must submit a signed, WRITTEN letter of complaint to the Board. The offending resident will be personally notified of the complaint. If offense reoccurs, the resident will be notified in writing and any further violations after the verbal/personal notification and written notification will result in a fine of \$25.00. Any resident who receives a notice of a violation, but believes none has occurred, may appeal to the Board of Directors in writing. The Board shall rule on the violation within 30 days and notify the resident in writing of its decision. Payment of fines shall be due on the 1st day of the month following the decision by the Board.**

**Effective March 16, 2016.**

Should you spot their webs in your deciduous trees, simply flush the webs out with a garden hose equipped with a jet-type nozzle. By destroying the webs, these pesky critters will have a hard time surviving.

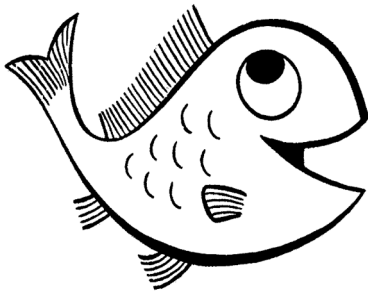

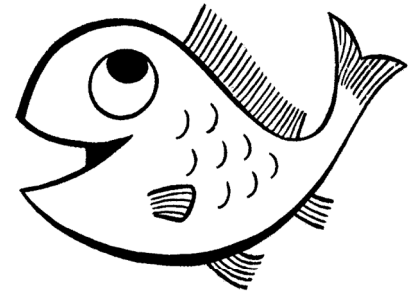

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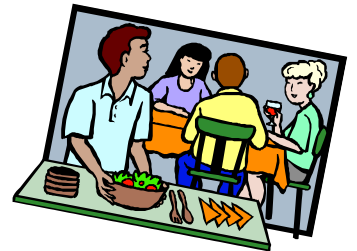
